KEEP YOUR DOG COOL AT SUMMER SHOWS AND EVENTS

(By Jill Warren, English Setter Association of America, AKC)

Summertime living is not easy for a fully coated English Setter. If you want to see what it's like for our dogs in hot weather, the next time it's 90-plus degrees, put on your warmest coat and go outside. Now try running.

English Setters, like most breeds, are by panting.

As you assemble your gear for summer dog events, you might consider including could develop heatstroke. Here are the the following:

- battery-operated fans shade cloths to cover your vehicle a canopy
- cool cloths
- plenty of cool water
- a rectal thermometer with lubricant (to take your dog's temperature if you suspect heatstroke)
- pediatric electrolyte solution (for the dog to drink if he gets dehydrated)

"Cool cloths" are made of chamois material, like those used to dry cars at a car wash. You can put a moist chamois on your dog's back without getting him too wet, take it off, and present him to the judge, who probably will only feel a tiny overheated, *immediately* take him to a bit of dampness when going over the dog.

don't put it directly into the ice. You don't conditioner running, or turn a fan on him. want to put anything ice-cold onto a dog, because that shrinks the blood vessels and actually generates more internal heat. but not cold.

cool is to have him stand on a damp towel submerge him in a tub of cool water. to help the footpads release heat. If you spray your dog with cool water, spray his it's a good idea to take him to the nearest underside that is not exposed to the hot sun vet for evaluation and treatment if (such as the groin area, where the hair is necessary.And we know you would never, less dense), the bottoms of his feet, and ever leave a dog in a closed vehicle when inside his mouth.

unusual breathing (rapid and loud) high rectal temperature (103 or higher) extreme thirst weakness and/or fatigue frequent vomiting disorientation a bright-red tongue and pale gums skin around the muzzle or neck doesn't snap back when pinched (dehydration) difficulty breathing thick saliva increased heart rate, collapse or coma

If you suspect that your dog is shady spot or into a cool indoor room, or If you keep your cool cloth in a cooler, into a cooled-off car with the air Separate his fur with your fingers so the cool air can penetrate to the skin.

To cool your dog down as quickly as Instead, whatever you apply should be cool possible, pour cool water over his head and body, or gently hose a very gentle stream Another good way to keep your dog of cool water over him, or, where possible,

As soon as your dog is somewhat stable, outside temperatures are above 60 degrees F..

WHITTIER VOTES AGAINST MANDATORY SPAYING/ **NEUTERING FOR DOGS**

Aug 12, 2015 - The Whittier City Council rejected the mandatory spay/neuter ("MSN") provisions of its proposed updated animal-control ordinance.

Like many other cities in Los Angeles County, Whittier contracts with the county's Department of Animal Care and Control for animal-control services. Nearly 10 years ago, the city had adopted the Los Angeles County's animal -control ordinance but chose to exclude the MSN provisions of the L. A. County code. Under the proposed update to the city's animal-control ordinance considered, the city would have adopted the MSN provisions of the county.
